
Increases in demand for services and volunteer numbers saw angelhands move to bigger offices in Maylands WA which are subsidised by the City of Bayswater and Lotterywest

angelhands broadened our service delivery to support all people to recover after trauma including violence, suicide, accident, terrorism and/or disaster.

Our part time staff (1.3 FTE) with the support of our trauma recovery angels (and volunteer admin team) continue to refine and consolidate our services to provide innovative therapeutic trauma recovery services.



#### **Guinness World Book of Records - Largest Gathering of Angels**

To mark World PTSD Day angelhands conducted an awareness raising event during which we attempted to break the Guinness World Book of Records for the largest gathering of angels in one place.

More than 700 people dressed as angels gathered at the Perth Convention Centre on 27 June 2018 to, increase community awareness of PTSD, reduce the stigma and increase help seeking, and build the profile of Angelhands and our services.


While not breaking the record, the event generated positive media and community interest and resulted in building a much bigger Angelhands footprint and profile.

#### angelhands Vision

To ensure people experiencing extreme trauma receive professional and social supports appropriate to assisting them on their recovery journey - rebuilding their resilience and enabling them to reclaim their place in society for the duration of their life journey.

## REPORT S WHO WE SUPPORT

## "angelhands supported 241 people including 181 new clients this financial year"

#### **OUR CLIENTS**

angelhands typical client is female (10% males, 88% female and 1.7% unspecified gender) aged between 20-70 years.

60 clients presented for therapeutic support after Domestic Violence, attending 137 session during which 167 hours of support was provided free by angelhands.

Of the 65% of clients whose ethinicity was recorded nearly, 60% were Non Aboriginal Australian, 15% Australian Aboriginal, and 10% British (the remaining included African, Chinese and New Zealand)

#### Trauma Recovery Angel Support Program

During the year 23 Trauma Recovery Angels (TRAs) provided over 1600 hours of support services to over 241 clients. Our clients are referred to angelhands through a range of different pathways including:

- Treating doctors and allied health providers
- Department of Communities
- Domestic and Family Violence service providers

#### Satellite Offices – Merriwa and Alkimos

In late 2017 angelhands identified the opportunity to extend our reach to people living in the far northern suburbs. With the


support of the City of Wanneroo, operating one day per week, initially in Merriwa and now Alkimos, our

#### **GATEWAY PROGRAM**

angelhands is partnering with the Department of Justice to work with young people and women who have suffered trauma and are involved in the justice system. At the heart of the program is to help deal with the impacts of trauma to assist program participants to thrive in their community settings.

This program has also been supported by Lotterywest and Minderoo

This pilot program will commence delivery early in 18/19.

#### The CREW4U Program

The CREW4U Program aims to:

- Increase wellbeing for people with trauma
- Reduce risk of co-morbid conditions
- Increase engagement with peers

Over the 10-module theraputic program people involved are able:

- Better managing their emotions
   Identifying self before their defining moment
- 3. Practicing controlling emotions and understanding inner peace
  4. Reflecting on their current selves and
- finding peace
- 5. Understanding the journey, they have been on
- Exploring self confidence
- Looking to the future and being inspired
- 8. Letting go of what can't be changed

9. Self-belief and goal setting 10. Applying learning and growth to move forward

In 17/18 the CREW4U Program was delivered in four terms over 35 sessions with 40 clients participating in sessions. Participation in the program can be a powerful, life changing event for clients. The evaluation process yielded a number of participant testimonials that speak to the profound personal experiences, some of which follow:

"this has been life-changing. I have felt numb with pain, anxiety and depression for most of my life. But Crew4U has allowed me to meet my feelings, to acknowledge them and to deal with the past. Angelhands was recommended to me by Lifeline, in a crisis moment. It was the best thing I have ever done – to call Lifeline".

"This program was something that I would never have considered previously. I live my life at 100 miles an hour so the exercises were challenging to begin with, however, over the course of the program I have learned a lot about myself and the choices open to me to help me through the developing period in my life. The program has provided me with coping strategies I may not have been exposed. The Angels have been wonder and so supportive. I am extremely grateful for this opportunity and genuinely believe that it will help me moving forward". N

#### Independent Audit Report to the members of Angelhands Incorporated

#### Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report of Angelhands Incorporated, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2018, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the declaration by members of the committee.

In our opinion the financial report of Angelhands Incorporated has been prepared in accordance with Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profils Commission Act 2012, Including:

- giving a true and fair view of the Association's financial position as at 30 June 2018 and of its financial performance for the year then ended; and
- (ii) complying with Australian Accounting Standards and Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013.

#### Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described as in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### Other Information

The association is responsible for other information. The other information comprises the information included in the association's annual report for the year ended 30 June 2018, but does not include the financial report and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial report does not cover the other information and accordingly we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial report, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial report or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

#### Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the Association to meet the requirements of Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

# REPORT S AUDITOR

#### Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, the management is responsible for assessing the Association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the management either intends to liquidate the Association or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Association's financial reporting process.

#### Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of the financial report.

As part of an audit in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards, we exercise professional judgement and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error, design and
  perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to
  provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for
  one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the
  override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate
  in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Association's internal
  control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the committee.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the committees' use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the
  audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant
  doubt on the Association's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we
  are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial report or, if such
  disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the
  date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Association to cease to continue as a
  going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial report, including the disclosures, and whether the financial report represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with the committee regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
